Five-module course map

Module	Active evidence to produce
1. formal analysis	Explain the central idea, complete an application, diagnose one plausible error, and connect it to the next module.
2. materials and techniques	Explain the central idea, complete an application, diagnose one plausible error, and connect it to the next module.
3. historical context	Explain the central idea, complete an application, diagnose one plausible error, and connect it to the next module.
4. patronage and power	Explain the central idea, complete an application, diagnose one plausible error, and connect it to the next module.
5. museums interpretation and provenance	Explain the central idea, complete an application, diagnose one plausible error, and connect it to the next module.

Reliable learning method

observe before interpreting, identify material and form, research context and provenance, compare evidence, and acknowledge uncertainty

Representative application

Analyze one object by separating direct visual evidence, historical documentation, later attribution, display context, and contested interpretation.

Weekly study cycle

1. Preview the objective and write two questions. 2. Attend or engage and capture decisions rather than every sentence. 3. Reconstruct the main idea within 24 hours. 4. Complete independent practice. 5. Analyze the first unsupported move on each error. 6. Use feedback. 7. Schedule a delayed mixed recheck.

Self-check before moving on

Can you explain the idea without notes, complete a fresh task, detect a near-miss, verify the result, and state a limitation? Watch especially for: describing subject matter without analyzing form or treating a museum label as neutral and complete.

What to save

an object study with formal analysis, context, provenance, source evaluation, comparative image, and citation
